Spring Oyster/Shrimp/Ham Dinner – Still need to recruit Chairperson

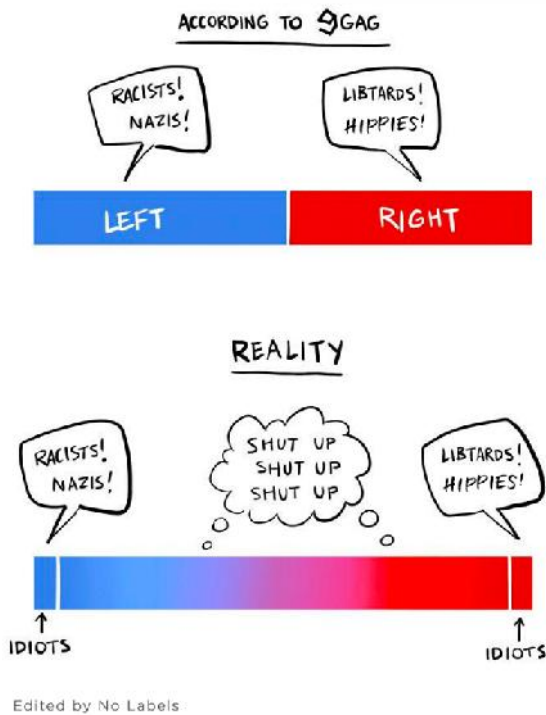

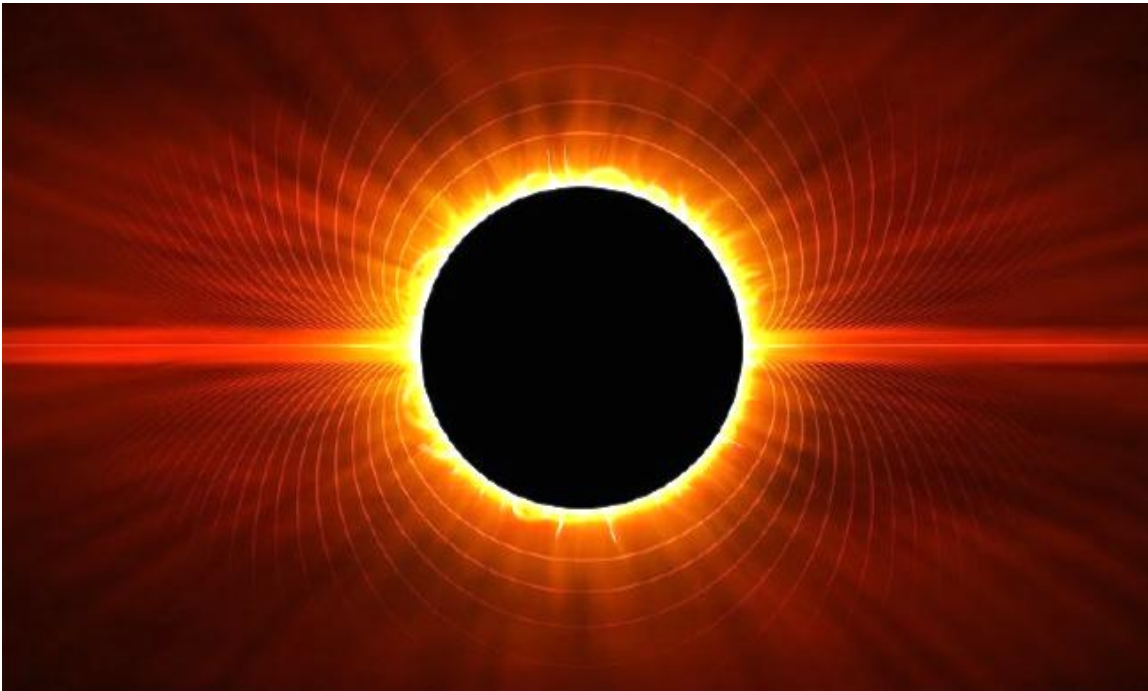
