• The Past several years the Club has been sponsoring Blind Adult Camper, Jody Kloop, for the Blind/Visually Impaired Camp

• Last year, Jody fell a few times at Camp and required Hospitalization when he returned home

• Even though he really enjoys camp, he needs closer supervision and he decided that he would not attend camp in 2020

• Jody received a Letter from Beacon Lodge Camp Coordinator, Ron Krepps, stating

o The staff at Beacon Lodge feels that Jody would be better suited for the "Assisted Living" session o For "Visually Impaired" Camp the Ratio of

Counselors to Camper was 1 to 8 (One counselor for 8 campers)

o This will change to 1 to 6 (One counselor for 6 campers) in 2020

o The "Assisted Living" camp Ratio of Counselors

to Camper is 1 to 4 (One counselor for 4 campers)

o Thus giving Jody Closer supervision

o The Activities are the same and Cost of Camp is the same

o The session is only 5 days instead of 11

• Jody is excited and would like to return to camp as part of the "Assisted Living" Session

• The Board agreed to sponsor Jody for this Camp as long as he agrees to listen to his counselors and report any problems he might encounter
