Customers line up, waiting to pick up their Friday night treats after a long day at work. The staff hustles about making, boxing and serving the house specialties, while drivers collect orders to deliver across town. The delicious smell of crispy, spicy wings and baked pepperoni pizza mix in the air with a hint of love.

Conahan had been working at Wild Wings since 2000 and Burns started in 2005. It wasn't until Conahan began to commute back and forth from college to work as a manager that the two met. At the time, the shop was owned by local businessman, Tim Hegeman.

Conahan spent two years learning all the behind-the-scenes details of the business, so when it was time to buy, he felt prepared. Burns noted that Conahan buying Wild Wings was life changing for the young couple.

Burns recalls a period of time when the business "took over their lives." There are times when Conahan can work up to 90 hours in a week. Burns, who earned her Master's degree in social work in 2014 and also works for PerformCare when not at Wild Wings, said, "There were times when we never saw each other." Over the years, they have gotten into a groove and their current solid staff has allowed for increased free time and focusing on new projects to boost business. Conahan felt prepared to run the day-to-day of the business when he bought it but notes how much the business scene in Ephrata and beyond has changed over the years. "There's a lot of competition in the area," stated Conahan. "The Internet and social media have made a huge difference in how you reach customers. You can no longer just rely on word of mouth." Burns agreed.

Over the last six and a half years, they have worked hard to run the business, create a routine and build a life together. They bought a local farmette in January 2019 and got engaged six months later. Conahan and Burns will tie the knot on June 2020 in Jamaica, before returning home to serve up some more love and pizza.

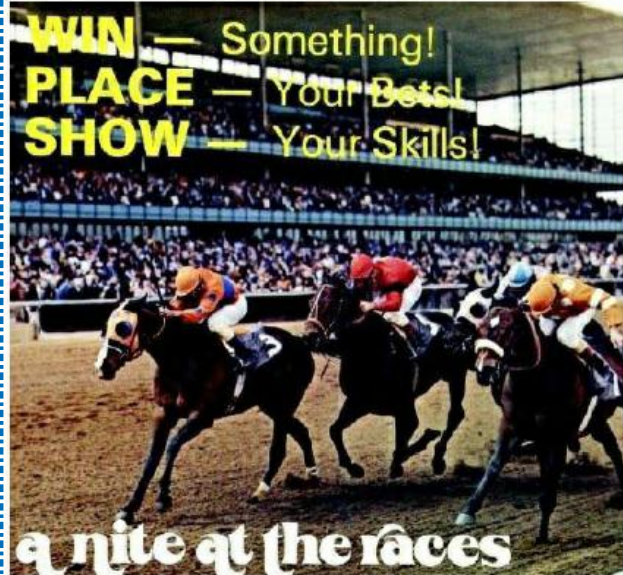
