On October 15, 2025, Lions Leo Maynard, Mark Janke, Jamie Carpenter, and Bruce Caroenter had the opportunity to attend "Dinner in the Dark", sponsored by the Paradise Township Lions Club to benefit Vision Corps. During dinner, they wore blindfolds or vision impairment simulator glasses to experience a meal while being blind. After the meal they discussed among themselves how they felt eating without being able to see.







I made some remarks after the Food Drives this past spring based on my misunderstanding of local Lion history. (We suck at communication; when I asked my sponsor back in '09 when I'd learn the "secret handshake" he just said "Pay attention. You'll pick it up.".)

PDG Craig Ebersole schooled me:

Stores all over the 2 counties quickly signed on and Lions clubs saw the positive impact for their communities. Our club only canvassed Weaver Market and we were challenged by one of the Manheim Twp clubs and Oregon Dairy for the top spot in the District. For Lion Bob Weaver, the program became a passion and the people of northern Lancaster county were the beneficiary of his efforts. Those efforts resulted in several tons of food and personal items being distributed by EASS.
